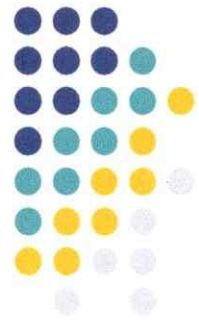

Supporting Others in Active Recovery (SOAR) is an evidence based program designed to assist clients on topics such as relapse prevention education and re-entry skills. The program is based on the Therapeutic Community Model. The program is separated from general population and provides a supportive recovery focused living environment.

Benefits

SOAR clients will be assigned to a SOAR clinician who will assist with treatment plan goals which are developed to assist with successful re-entry into the community. Each SOAR participant will be required to complete the MORE curriculum (My Ongoing Recovery Experience) by Hazelden Publishing. Upon successful completion of SOAR, ninety (90) days of program good time credit will be awarded. While enrolled in SOAR, clients will be eligible to participate in one additional evidence based program such as MRT, MRT Parenting, MRT Anger Management, and New Directions. Any client enrolled in SOAR who does not have a GED or high school diploma will be encouraged to attend GED classes. Clients may request to remain in the program after the initial 6 month completion, however good time will only be awarded one time. Clients who choose to remain in the SOAR dorm are required to hold a job, continue to establish goals for success, follow program guidelines and be a leader in the community.

Criteria

- Must have completed a DOC approved Substance Abuse Program.
- If not recommended SAP, Client must have completed a Moral Recognition Therapy program. If housed in a facility in where MRT is not offered, consideration will be made during review.
- Evidence of a relapse since SAP completion will result in a denial for the SOAR Program and a recommendation may be made for SAP.
- Must have 60 days of clear conduct for Category 3-11 and Category 4 or above disciplinary violations.
- Must have completed SOTP (Sex Offender Treatment Program) requirements prior to admission.
- Must meet CPP classification policy to be housed at the facility.
- There cannot be a break in custody since SAP completion.

How to Apply

- You may pick up and submit an SOAR application with Substance Abuse Program staff or Jail staff.
- SOAR applications may be forwarded via email to the Division of Addiction Services or mail to P.O. Box 2400, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602. (This is the same process as a SAP application)
